

OPEN CLASS

All Classes are open to all ages! Enter early...and enter as many classes as desired

Open class entries are judged as a competition. There will be only one first place, one second place, and one third place winner in each category.

ALL ENTRIES SHOULD BE PRE-REGISTERED. Pre-registration may be done and entry tags received at BOONE COUNTY EVENT CENTER at the Boone County Fairgrounds, Albion on Thursday evening, July 8, 5:00 to 8:00 p.m. **DO NOT TAKE ITEMS ON THURSDAY.** This is only for registration. Take all entries on Saturday, July 10, 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. Take tags and items and pre-registrations to the east end of BOONE COUNTY EVENTS CENTER BEFORE 12:00 PM. Entries will not be accepted after 12:00 p.m., unless approved by the superintendent. Judging starts at 1:30 p.m., Saturday, July 10. Only one item per entry number is allowed per person.

It is recommended that individuals with numerous entries register early and have entry tags ready prior to entry to assist in easy check-in of entries. For early registration, contact Theresa Scheffler at 402-395-2336. Tags may be picked up at the 4-H Extension office. For further information contact Jeryl Kettelsen at 402-386-5636.

Open Class premium money may be collected and all entries removed on July 14, 2010, at the open class building after 8:00 p.m. Premiums will not be awarded to entries removed before 8:00 p.m. All premiums not collected on July 14 will be sent to participants by mail. All checks must be cashed by October 10, 2010. Refer any and all matters not covered by the rules to the Fair Board. A special premium of \$6.00 will be awarded to the top exhibitor in each adult class.

JUNIOR DIVISION AGE 12 AND UNDER

- 1.) Junior exhibitors are not eligible for top exhibitor.
- 2.) All exhibits must not have been exhibited at the Boone County Fair previously.
- 3.) Junior exhibitors may exhibit in all divisions & classes.
- 4.) **In the Farm or Garden Class, they are limited to a total of five (5) exhibits only.**
- 5.) Junior exhibitors who place first, second or third will receive the same premium money as in the adult classes.

DIVISION A- FARM PRODUCTS

Premium Prizes will be awarded for each entry as follows:

1st Place • \$2 (Blue Ribbon) 2nd Place • \$1.50 (Red Ribbon)

3rd Place • \$1 (White Ribbon)

This class is open to Boone County products only. All entries must be from current year unless otherwise stated. Only one item per entry number is allowed per person.

The following rules will govern exhibits: All exhibits must be raised by exhibitor. No exhibitor shall be allowed more than one entry for each premium. No special entries will be allowed in this class. Non-placing entries may be taken home after judging. All exhibits must be true to entry as to variety and classification or otherwise they may be changed by the judge and superintendent. Put private mark on all plates and glasses - it may save you trouble when you take away your exhibit. Parties other than exhibitors must not remove any of the exhibits. This rule to be strictly enforced by the superintendent of this class. All fruit and vegetable entries will be displayed on a sturdy, disposable white plate.

CLASS 1 - THRESHED SMALL GRAINS

One-eighth bushel and cleaned - displayed in 5 qt. (ice cream) pail

1. Winter Wheat

2. Spring Wheat
3. Early White Oats
4. Any other small grain

CLASS 2 - THRESHED FIELD SEEDS

May be 2009 Crop - displayed in 5 qt. (ice cream) pail

6. Soybeans
7. Hybrid Milo Red Seed
8. Hybrid Milo Yellow Seed
9. Any other field seed

CLASS 3 - THRESHED GRASS SEED AND LEGUME

May be 2009 Crop - displayed in 5 qt. (ice cream) pail

10. Alfalfa
11. Sweet Clover, white or yellow
12. Bromus
13. Red Clover
14. Vetch
15. Any other grass seed and legume

CLASS 3A - SHEAF DISPLAY

Sheaf grain and grasses shall not be less than 3" in diameter at center or band, and of current year. Grain sheaves shown without leaves except soybeans.

20. Alfalfa Sheaf Seeded
21. Vetch
